- Cyclic Inquiry update:

"This year the College will be participating in a Cyclic Inquiry. This has replaced the former School Review process. We provide information/data to an external panel. Members of FoF and/or the parent/carer community will be asked to be a part of this process and provide feedback."

The agenda for Cyclic Inquiry to be devised in the coming weeks -

- System Approach Cyclic Inquiry is taking a new approach. The College comes up with recommendations with the aim of improving outcomes for staff and students.
- Maximising local impact through collective focus Schools working together in the diocese.
- Diocesan approach/focus Every child can improve.
- 4 Year Cycle Every school has an Annual Improvement Plan (AIP) (which focuses on faith, learning and wellbeing x 3 years)
- Then a year of renewal.
- The Cyclic Inquiry team will work with staff, students, parents and the Parish Priest.

The College has come up with 6 Recommendations

- 1. College Mission and Vision
 - We have a Vision and Mission, but not sure how well people know these.
 - We will develop a framework which outlines these.
 - We will embed these doc's into everything we do.

Clear and meaningful Charism • Lack of certainty what our charism is. • Even current staff think SFCC has 2 charisims • SFCC has a duel patronage but 1 charism • We value both. • We are not good at Catholic symbolism at the school. • Daily practices - We need a college prayer. • Can parents speak to the touchstones
Anna - Was surprised we didn't have a College prayer. MCMM - We use the Prayer of St Francis. This is an opportunity for our students to perhaps develop a SFCC prayer. Michelle - In Sydney Diocese, students are given set prayers to
learn. Do we have the same thing in the Wollongong Diocese? Michelle stated that as a community we have some connection with the parish, however, something is needed to improve this connection. It must be strengthened.
MCMM - We have built the Sacramental Program. Anna - A Grade Mass on the weekend and each family should bring a plate for morning tea. MCMM - Many of our students are connected to other parishes.
3. Quality Deep Teaching and learning - New Pedagogies for Deep Learning (NPDL)
 Develop a vision for learning and share that with parents.

	 Develop these competencies without forgetting literacy and numeracy. 4. Safe and positive learning environment The Tell Them From Me (TTFM) survey will be shared with parents on Wednesday. Respectful relationships is an area that appears to be coming up as an area that requires further work. This includes restorative practices (What do you do when you make a mistake?) We need to enhance/clarify how we should be treating each other. If respectful relationships are improved, we should see less incidents of sexualised behavior.
