OPEN DAY

Last Saturday 9th March saw hundreds of people visit St Francis to meet the staff, examine the facilities and hear our senior leaders speak about the future direction of the College, our approach to Pastoral Care, Teaching and Learning.

The feedback from the day was overwhelmingly positive. Prospective parents and students were impressed with the displays of student work, the demonstrations and vision for the future. STAFFING APPOINTMENTS

Student Notes and Office Procedures

As a College we have many notes go home that require parent/ carer response in order for either permission to be given for a student to access an activity, or numbers/food selection to be submitted to cater for an event. Unfortunately, it has been increasingly obvious to College Reception staff that not only are notes not being returned, but the College is having to re-photocopy notes time and time again.

Photocopying additional notes and making phone calls to parents is an additional impost on the time of our College Reception staff and additional photocopying has a negative impact on the environment.

As per last year, the following processes will apply regarding notes sent home from the College:-

- A note will only be sent home ONCE per family or per student. St Francis sends notes home to the endest child only where a family response is warranted, or the note applies to the whole family, and individual notes home at all other times.
- To assist parents/carers, College Reception staff will maintain their practice of sending copies of notes on our Skoolbag app. It is VITAL that all parents/carers have downloaded this free app as the College uses it as an important instant communication tool.
- The note will also be emailed to all applicable families.
- Notes WILL NOT BE RE-COPIED. If your note is misplaced, please download it from the Skoolbag app or email and print yourself a copy.

Any note that is not handed in by the due date will no longer be accepted. Unfortunately, this means if a student has not submitted their note they will not be permitted to participate in the relevant event/activity.

This policy is common practice in schools, particularly in schools with large student numbers, and will assist us with workflow and to reduce costs. Receiving notes promptly provides accurate numbers for events, also helping us to minimise costs. It also means we can best determine transport and catering requirements and reduce waste.

Youth Ministry - LIVE Term 1 Event

I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full (John 10:10). This is what it means to be truly full of life - or LIVE.

Each year in the Diocese of Wollongong, each secondary school is blessed to have the Catholic Youth Ministry Wollongong (CYMW) team visit the school three times a year to run LIVE. The aim of LIVE is to draw young people into responsible participation in the life, mission and work of the Catholic Church and forge a strong sense of community.

On Thursday 28th February, students at St Francis were invited to experience their first LIVE event of the year, focusing on the theme "Who am I?". The first part of LIVE was a lunchtime concert where the CYMW team performed live music under the COLA from their mobile stage. This lunchtime concert was open not just to our secondary students but also to our students in Years 3-6, one of the many benefits for students of a K-12 school.

After school, the second part of LIVE took place with our Year 7-9 students participating in an optional retreat afternoon where the theme "Who am I?" was explored in greater depth. Students were treated to afternoon tea, a game, live music, a talk, small group discussion, worship and dinner. We were pleased to have 99 students in attendance at this optional afternoon session. This group of students was the largest group the CYMW team has seen at a LIVE event. Being the school with the smallest secondary contingent in the Diocese of Wollongong, this is an excellent testimony to our students willingness to embrace our College motto of 'Open Minds, Open Hearts'.

For our Year 7-9 students who want to ensure they are free for our remaining two LIVE events of the year, the dates and themes are as follows:

- Thursday 27th June (Week 9, Term 2) Who is He?
- Thursday 7th November (Week 4, Term 4) Who are we?

Additionally, for our Year 7-9 students who enjoyed LIVE and want more before Term Two, the CYMW team run a non-school affiliated event called LIVE Local - a youth group for Year 7-12 students which runs from 7-9pm each Friday night of the school term at St John's Campbelltown.

This term, LIVE Local will culminate with an Easter celebration on Friday 12th April.

Finally, as Pope Francis reminded the young people in attendance at the final Mass of World Youth Day in Panama earlier this year -

We are on a journey. Keep walking, keep living the faith and sharing it.

And do not forget, you are not the tomorrow, you are not the 'meantime', you are the Now of God.

SPLICED Project

SPLICED is a project run in Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Wollongong.

It has been designed to provide differentiated units of works for learners identified as intellectually gifted.



SPLICED stands for Stretching Potential Learning in Interactive Challenging Environments in the Diocese of Wollongong.

Students involved in this project are selected based on testings, observations and recommendations from the school. Students are invited to join the program and must choose their own open ended topic based on the annual theme which results in a powerful manifest with an accompanying creative work. This year the theme is "The Good, The Beautiful and The True."

On Monday, St Francis Catholic College sent 6 students to attend a workshop for SPLICED in Studio 5 Campbelltown. Our Year 6 students included Tejas A, Sneha S, Jacob T and Sebastian O, along with Ellie M from Year 5 and Jiya K from Year 4.

Sneha has decided to write a script based on Mindfulness and how each individual has the ability to control their own thoughts. She aims to get her message across to everyone by creating an artwork in video mode. Sneha will have the opportunity to work with a professional artist to create her artwork and also a professional writer to help script her work.

Jiya is working on a traditional Indian dance called Bharatanatyam and the meaning of each of the actions in the dance. She hopes to create a slideshow with a speech about the beauty, truth and goodness of this dance. Jiya too will work with a mentor to help her achieve her goal.

Jacob wants to compose a poem that explains how a supernova occurs and the stages involved. He will show the beauty of the supernova through an artwork to support his poem. He was able to spend time with a poet to help develop his ideas into verses of his poem.

Ellie wants to develop a project that shows others the range of emotions that they can go through when dealing with sickness and death in a family. She hopes that people will take comfort from her work and will see the beauty in having deep relationships with others. Ellie spent time with an artist at the workshop to help her create one of her four paintings.

Sebastian aims to share with people his own belief that there is amazing potential in every human - you just have to believe. He aims to compose a poem that represent hopes and dreams and wants to create an artwork that visualises this.

Tejas wants to compose a poem with multiple verses that explains how the Greek Gods have influenced and built our world. He wants to create a symbolic artwork to complement his poetry. The students' topics are varied and all very interesting. I look forward to seeing these projects develop over the year with further workshops, hard work, editing and making use of the feedback from their mentors.
