

The QUBE Project allows students to follow independent pathways to connect their outside passions while being guided by the college Vision Action Statements. The Project is designed to extend the students' capacity to think critically, creatively and reflectively by generating new ideas, considering new perspectives and solving problems.

Learners are required to:


- Manage the creative nature of the content and tasks
- Display critical and creative thinking skills
- Work independently with appropriate levels of mentoring
- Commit to the task and respond positively to feedback
- Persist and persevere
- Self evaluate and set high standards



SUCCESS CRITERIA

To be successful in The QUBE Project, students must have:

- A process journal, with dated and timed entries, that will document their progress from the beginning to completion. The journal may include:
 - Images, graphs, diagrams, photos, drawings, mind-maps, etc.
 - Text gathered from a variety of sources such as, newspaper and magazine articles, reference material, research, reflections, suggestions from critical friends, teacher's notes, mentor's notes, etc.
- A creation of a major work/s in any chosen form/s, communicating a solution to the driving question that was formulated
- A manifesto outlining your:
 - Intentions (what you intend to do)
 - Opinions (what you believe needs to change about the world and why, what inspired your driving question)
 - Vision (the type of world that you dream about and wish to create though your action/product)



SELECTION CRITERIA

- The QUBE Project is open to students in Stage 4.
- To to be eligible to apply for selection into The QUBE Project, the following criteria must be met:
 - An excellent attitude towards school
 - A minimum of 4 A's or B's on your report card in any subject
 - A passion to learn
 - A commitment to the school values outlined in the school diary with a sound behaviour record
 - 100% commitment whilst in the program.

Failure to meet these requirements may lead to removal from the program.

• There will be a capped number of students chosen to participate in the The QUBE Project.



ENROLMENT PROCESS

- Enrolment into The QUBE Project requires an annual application. There is no automatic guarantee of acceptance. Students may apply the following year if they are not selected.
- The applications for enrolment are due 4pm on Friday 25
 September 2020. NO LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED
- All relevant copies of reports, references, certificates, awards, and/or achievements MUST be attached to the application for consideration.
- Students may be interviewed and/or photographed by the media. It is a requirement that the *Consent for the use of student image form* is completed for all students selected into the program.
- On the basis of the selection criteria for enrolment, an interview list will be developed and offers for interviews will be made. The application DOES NOT guarantee an interview. The selection criteria must be met
- Interviews will take place during Week 2 of Term 4
- At the completion of the interview process, successful applicants will be sent an Acceptance of Offer into The QUBE Project. By signing this, both students and parents/carers indicate their acceptance of the conditions of enrolment into the program.
