Term 2: Writing

We are learning to write an explanation about the lifecycle of a chicken.

How can I improve my child's writing and spelling?

Plan

- Speak their ideas first (speech to text).
- What will happen at the beginning/middle/end?
- Word bank 'Wow' Words: adjectives, nouns, technical language, etc.

Reread

Objective by Does it make sense?

Writing Ideas for Home:


- **Purpose** and **audience** for their writing E.g. Write instructions on how to tie shoe laces for your sister, write letters (to cousins, friends, etc.)
- Journal writing handwritten or iPad
- Story book
- Alternate ending rewriting the ending to their favourite book.


Spelling

- Letters & Sounds (homework) sound talk, break the word into syllables.
- Dictionary meaning

How can I improve my child's handwriting?

- Head, body and tail letters correct letter formation.
- Correct pencil grip
- Fine motor activities to strengthen muscles in fingers - playdough, making bead jewellery, weaving around cardboard.









How can I develop my child's love of reading and writing?

- Visit the local library and borrow books that they're interested in a range of texts (books, comics, non-fiction).
- Book Review of books they've previously read.
 - Why did/didn't you like the book? Reading log (homework)
 - Home readers one fiction and one non-fiction.
- Read to someone.
- Record their reading voice and listen to it self reflect.

Writing Ideas for Home:

- Purpose for their writing E.g. Write instructions on how to tie shoe laces for your sister, write letters (to cousins, friends, etc.),
- Journal writing handwritten or iPad
- Story book
- Alternate ending rewriting the ending to their favourite book.



What strategies can I use when my child forgets a word when reading?

- Picture walk before reading the book.
- Frame the word.
- Write tricky word on a post-it note before and during reading the book.
- Find the little words in big words.
- Sound talk the word.
- Reread the sentence.
- Read on and go back to the word.
- 'Word of the Week' read the word before/after school, before/after dinner, etc.
