




Kindergarten to Year 6 cycle RESETS at the end of Year 6 for Year 7 to 12 cycle

Behaviour Management


Traffic Lights



Green Light: all students start here daily. Students are given a gentle reminder when inappropriate behaviour is displayed and a positive choice is encouraged to be followed

Yellow light: If student continues to make the wrong choice a warning is given. Once a student moves from the green light they cannot go back until the next day.

Red light: Student can receive a time out in-class, time out in another class or time out with a leadership member.



Curriculum Overview

Please find below an overview of the curriculum to be covered this term in Year 4 Green.

Religious Education taught by Mrs Sarah Hains

Living the Law of Love

Students will explore the 'law of love' by recalling the purpose of rules in groups and communities. Students will examine the Ten Commandments, focusing on their purpose and principles for living in relationship with God and each other. This forms the basis for introducing and exploring Jesus' 'new commandment' with reference back to the Commandments. Students will have a deeper understanding of how the Commandments and Jesus' 'new commandment' guide us in living in relationship with God and others.

Lent: A Time to Make Choices

Students will identify that Lent is a time of reflection. They will explain the significance of the sacrament of Reconciliation and describe the events of Holy Week.

English taught by Miss Sara Issa

Pictures tell the story

In this unit students will develop their understanding of how stories can be communicated using images – both still images and moving images. They will engage in interpretation of the settings, events, characters and themes expressed in a variety of texts. They will also learn some of the visual codes and conventions used by illustrators and filmmakers to communicate their stories and engage with their audience. Students will also take part in spelling activities where they will learn to apply a variety of spelling strategies.

Mathematics taught by Mrs Sarah Hains

The following units of work will be studied this term. The Maths homework set on Studyladder each week will give you more information about what has been covered in the unit and will be a revision of the content taught during the week.

Whole Number - students will ask questions and use efficient mental and written strategies with increasing fluency to solve problems. They use technology to investigate mathematical concepts and check their solutions. Students use appropriate terminology to describe and link mathematical ideas, check statements for accuracy and explain their reasoning. Students count, order, read and record numbers of up to five digits.

Data - students will select appropriate methods to collect data, and construct, compare, interpret and evaluate data displays, including tables, picture graphs, and column graphs.

Addition & Subtraction - students will use mental and written strategies to solve addition and subtraction problems of 2, 3, 4 and 5 digit numbers. Students will select the appropriate strategies to solve problems.

Human Society and Its Environment taught by Mrs Sarah Hains

First Contacts

Students are introduced to world history and the movements of people. Beginning with the history of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, students will examine European exploration and colonisation in Australia and throughout the world up to the early 1800's.



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Science and Technology taught by Miss Sara Issa

Changing Earth

Students focus on changes caused to the Earth's surface as a result of natural and human interactions. Students will investigate natural processes and human activity to understand the need for sustainable practices. Students also learn about 'careful' and responsible attention to and management of natural resources to ensure they are protected and available for future generations.

Creative Arts taught by Miss Sara Issa

Music - Rhythm and Cups

A variety of activities will be taught that assist students in understanding the difference between a beat and rhythm. Students will learn a variety of notes used in traditional music notation and perform a variety of rhythms using cups as a musical instrument.

Visual Arts - Australian Landscapes

Students will study and discuss artworks based on Australian landscapes. Including a study of Australian artists: Jeannie Baker (mixed-media illustrations), John Olsen (aerial landscapes) and Sally Morgan (symbolic landscapes referencing the dreamtime).

Personal Development, Health and Physical Education taught by Mr Spiros Zakris and Mrs Jessica Gallaty

Sport - Cross Country and Athletics

In this unit students will develop and practice skills in cross country and in the athletic events of running (including starting starts and crouch starts), long jump, shot put and discus. This learning is in preparation for the school cross country trial in Term 1 and the athletics carnival at the start of Term 2.

Health - This term, students describe strategies used to predict and manage their emotions before making a decision and identify influences on personal choices and decision making. They identify safe and supportive behaviour and protective strategies and recognise types of abuse and bullying behaviours.

Year 4 Homework

The SFCC Homework Policy states that the expected time for homework for Year 3 and 4 students is 20 minutes each afternoon. Approximately 10 minutes should be spent on reading and 10 minutes on Maths. Homework will be distributed and explained on Fridays and then collected the following Thursday. If appropriate, students are provided with a home reader that is at an independent reading level each week or students may read their library book or a book from home. Please ensure your child is filling in their reading log correctly and that they are completing the relevant activities on Studyladder.

Please ensure your child has both a paint shirt and a set of headphones/earphones at school everyday!




2 breaks occur during the school day

CEDoW STUDENT RESPONSIBLE USE OF TECHNOLOGY AGREEMENT



Technology resources are available to all CEDoW students. The effective use of technology relies on the responsible conduct of the users who must adhere to the following agreement, school based processes and respecting the dignity of all involved in line with our Catholic ethos. I acknowledge my use of technology can be viewed and monitored. Inappropriate use will result in subsequent actions in line with the school's behaviour management processes.

1. Respect Myself

As a respectful user I will:

- 1.1 only access, create, store and/or post material using appropriate language and images that are not hurtful, abusive or offensive and respects my privacy
- 1.2 understand that technology in CEDoW Schools (including the Internet) are for learning related activities
- 1.3 acknowledge that my device is a learning tool and only used for learning related activities whilst at school
- 1.4 not use my device for recreational gaming whilst at school
- 1.5 only log in using my username and password, provided by the School and not share my individual login and password details with others
- 1.6 not bypass or attempt to bypass network or security settings
- 1.7 treat all technologies and data with respect and due care
- 1.8 take due care to check the source, accuracy and reliability of any information obtained from the Internet
- 1.9 promptly report to staff any inappropriate material that is accidentally accessed
- 1.10 regularly backup my work from my device to my Google Drive and/or other storage media
- 1.11 adhere to age restrictions for applications and websites
- 1.12 not use technology to commit legally prohibited offences.

2. Respect Others

As a respectful user I will:

- 2.1 only post material that respects the privacy of students, staff and the wider community including not taking or sharing photos without permission
- 2.2 only post material that uses appropriate language that is not hurtful, abusive or offensive
- 2.3 not use technology to harass, bully, pursue unwanted contact or manipulate others
- 2.4 not create, access, store or share offensive images, video or audio files
- 2.5 only use the work of others with acknowledgement or permission
- 2.6 not access another's account, folders, files or work
- 2.7 not reveal personal information such as addresses or contact numbers over the Internet, including my own
- 2.8 not use another person's technology without permission.

2. Respect Property

As a respectful user I will:

- 3.1 fully charge my device each evening in preparation for the next school day
- 3.2 transport and store technology safely and securely
- 3.3 not use technology outside (playground or walkways) during recess and lunchtime unless specifically directed by a staff member to do so
- 3.4 take all reasonable precautions to ensure that my device is kept clean and not damaged or lost
- 3.5 promptly report any damage to technology to the relevant staff.
